Head Women's Basketball Coach

Sixth Head Coach in Youngstown State history



- Boldon has spent three years as a collegiate head coach and 10 years as a college assistant. Five of those 10 years have been at the Division I level, including two seasons at Akron. He spent last season as the top assistant coach at Division I Florida Gulf Coast University in Fort Myers, Fla.

- Boldon has been to two national championship games in his coaching career. He was an assistant coach on Walsh's 1997-98 NAIA Division II National Championship team. He also led Lambuth to the NAIA national title game as a head coach in 2008-09.

- As a head coach, his career record is 59-32 over three seasons. Two of those were spent at the University of Arkansas at Monticello, where he improved the Cotton Blossoms' conference win total by seven in his first year. Boldon coached Lambuth to a 29-5 record.

- Boldon has been an assistant at seven different institutions, but he has only been on the bench with three different head coaches. He has spent four seasons with Karl Smesko, who is the current head coach at Florida Gulf Coast. Boldon has also coached five years with Jodi Kest, the head coach at Akron.

- Last season, Florida Gulf Coast went 24-7 and played in the Women's National Invitational Tournament. The Eagles lost 70-57 to Miami, which went on to finish as the tournament's runner-up.

- At Akron, Boldon helped lead the Zips to 10 wins in his first season in 2006-07, which was two more wins than the previous two years combined. His recruits helped Akron finish with school records for wins (18), conference victories (11) and home wins (11).

- Boldon has also been an assistant at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Gannon, IPFW and Wilmington.

- Boldon is a 34-year-old native of Louisville, Ohio, located just outside of Canton. He was a two-time All-America selection and four-year starter at point guard at Walsh University. He was inducted to the school's Wall of Fame in 2008.
